## **Biographical Sketch:**

"A versatile musician, an obsessive fan and archivist, and a mainstay of the Nashville music scene for two decades, the late Argyle Bell was a gifted original. The lanky Tacoma, Wash., native cut a striking figure walking around town in his head-to-toe black outfits, his wraparound shades, muttonchop sideburns, and teased-out coif. "I never saw Argyle in a car," remembers Adam Dread, who hosted him on his mid-'80s WRVU radio show. "He was always walking, always smiling." Bell brightened staid Music City by flashing his own brand of rock-star glitz, especially after becoming a denizen of the erstwhile hipster haven Close Quarters (now the Bound'ry). He claimed he once got loaded with Jim Morrison and saw the Velvet Underground play with Nico, but it was his own accomplishments that endeared him to friends and fellow musicians. He put together the first Gram Parsons tribute show, wrote now and then for The Metro, and gigged (word has it) with everyone from Garth Brooks to members of the Burritos, Byrds, Eagles, and Rolling Stones. And as the former "musical director" at Séanachie, he did as much as anyone to boost the city's emerging Irish music scene. Most importantly, Bell was a great guy."

## **Scope and Content:**

This collection includes flyers, periodicals, and ephemera from musician, promoter, and writer Argyle Bell, related to his own career in Nashville in the 1980s and 1990s. His

personal interests appear as a collection of teen fan magazines from the 1960s, and in cassette and VHS tapes. Family material provides a personal background.

#### **Arrangement:**

Argyle Bell had some original arrangements in promotional and press items, personal records, and periodicals related to his career and interests; the processing archivist created an organization order by thematic topic for ease of access and preservation.

  Argyle Bell booked a show at Seanachie for Declan Mulligan, an original member
  of The Beau Brummels. Folder includes flyers, press clippings used for flyers,
  and a letter from Mulligan to Bell.

  Organized and labelled by Bell, this folder focuses on Irish music events he promoted, booked, and/or performed in the late 1990s and includes flyers, newsprint clippings, some photocopied.
- Folder 8: Flyers and Clippings: Irish Music Fest and International Music Fest
  Originally from the early 1990s, Irish Music Fest gets revived by Bell in the late
  '90s with a larger scope as the International Music Fest, aided by his involvement
  booking international acts in Nashville.

  This folder contains flyers and press clippings related to Bell's booking and promotional activities as music director at Seanachie in the late 1990s.

## Box 4: Photographs

Folder 1: Photos & Clippings of the Gram Parsons and Clarence White Tribute Shows

These contents were organized by Argyle Bell and stored together by him in a box for photographic prints. These tribute shows ran from 1986-1990 and included performers such as Marty Stuart, Roland White (Clarence White's brother), and former members of the Flying Burrito Brothers Al Perkins and Rob Strandlund. Jimmy Ibbotson, Jody Maphis, Peter Rowan, Rodney Crowell, J.D. Foster, John Nuese (International Submarine Band) are also identified. According to the cover of Cosmic American Music News (Box 3, Folder 2), many, if not all, of these photos are by Chip Smith.

Folder 2: "Plastic Paddy"

This set was organized and titled by Argyle Bell and includes photos of his Irish music group Plastic Paddy performing live at Seanachie Irish Pub. Most of these are dated to 1999.

Folder 3: "Argyle Pub. Photos"

This set was organized and labelled by Argyle Bell. Photos include him with Buck Owens, publicity photos with musical partner Steve Haggard, live performances, travel, a signed picture with Al Franken, several prints from the Gram Parsons Tribute Shows, and an early glossy of him in Lee Rogers' Stampede Pass, a late 70's Seattle country group.

## **Box 7: Cassette Tapes**

This box includes many sets of tapes related to Argyle Bell and his interests.

The "Irish Tape Series" includes 10 cassettes numbered by Bell, from 1998 and 1999, that includes taped rehearsals and masters.

There are 8 Plastic Paddy rehearsal and work tapes from his Irish music group. There are 6 labelled Demo or Master of his own music, including recorded and live tapes. For the Gram Parsons and Clarence White Tribute shows, organized by Bell himself, there are 5 tapes in all: one from the first show in 1986, and then four from the 4<sup>th</sup> show in 1989. Argyle Bell's collection of Gram Parsons related music includes 16 tapes, several of which are live recordings, some still unreleased commercially. See archivist for a full list.

# **Box 8: Cassette Tapes**

This box includes cassette tapes of other groups, including some commercial recordings, as well as a significant amount of tapes related to Bell's roommate, Susie Monick, with some of those tapes possibly being recorded by Bell himself.
